ABSTRACT

Organized political youth work? This might sound rather scary to most young people. Yet, political youth organizations have remained a crucial pillar of youth participation in any liberal democracy. In fact, it is often political youth organizations that are confronted with the difficult task of laying the groundwork for political participation—as they tend to be the first contact point for young citizens entering into their political lives. This means that political youth organizations should not understand themselves as mere change-makers (although this is an important part of organized political youth work) but also as political educators. This online webinar will guide seminar participants through interactive tasks, online lectures, daily check-in and AMA sessions, and expert Q&As. Due to the constraint of the different time zones, participants will be working on their daily projects in regional teams. Each team will have a dedicated facilitator (available online) to guide them through the process.

Duration: 10 days, six full content days + 1 onboarding/logistics + 1 final presentations + breaks

This seminar is a fully fletched IAF program. It will require participants to dedicate their time fully to this program from 15 - 25 February. We highly recommend keeping this timeframe free from other obligations like work or other obligatory courses at university.

- Zoom (for daily check-in, online lecturers and expert sessions)

- Notion (for resources and eLearning components)
