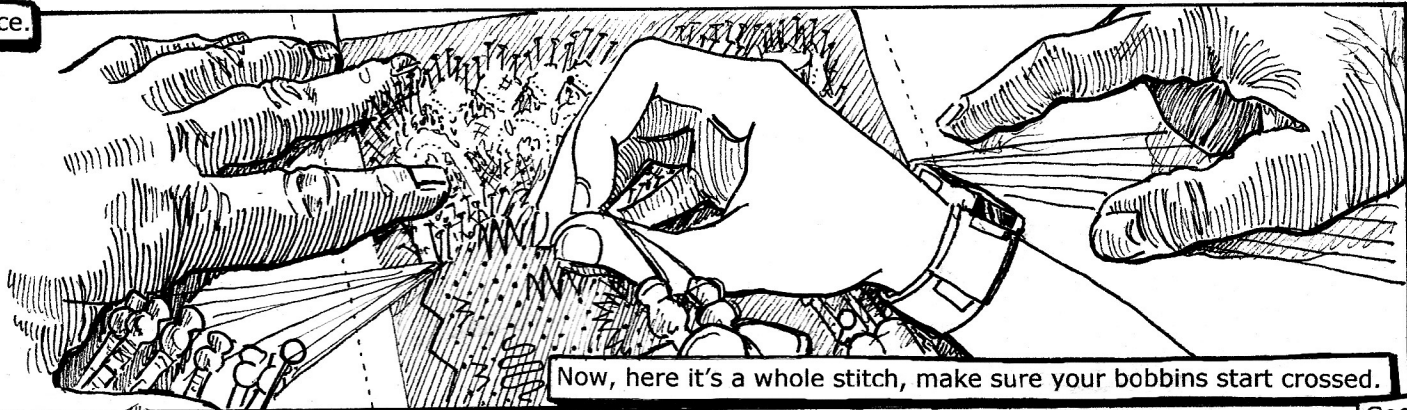


Patience.

Over. Pin. Over. Over. Over. Twist.

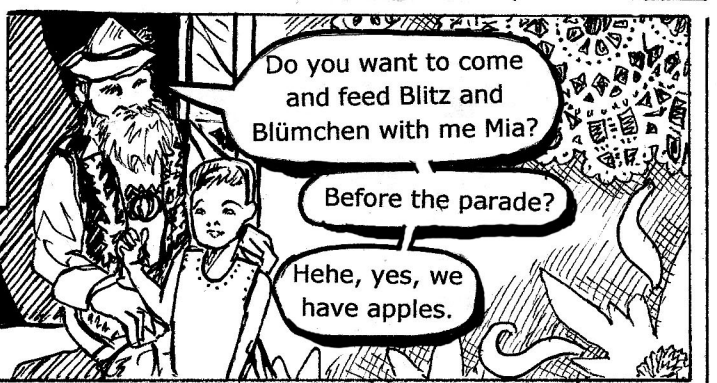
Over. Over. Pin. Over. Over. Over.

Authenticity, huh.

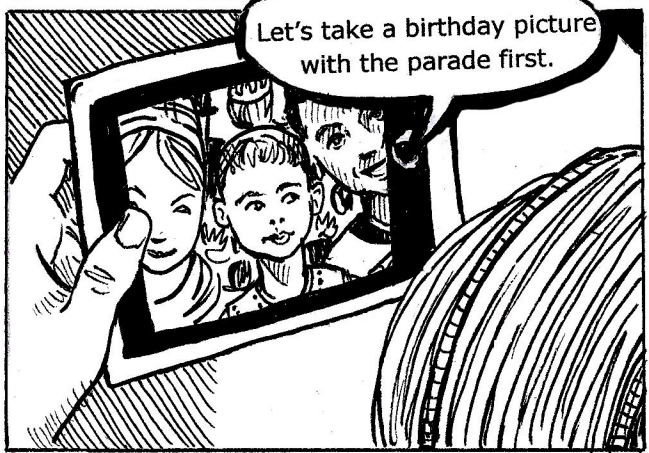

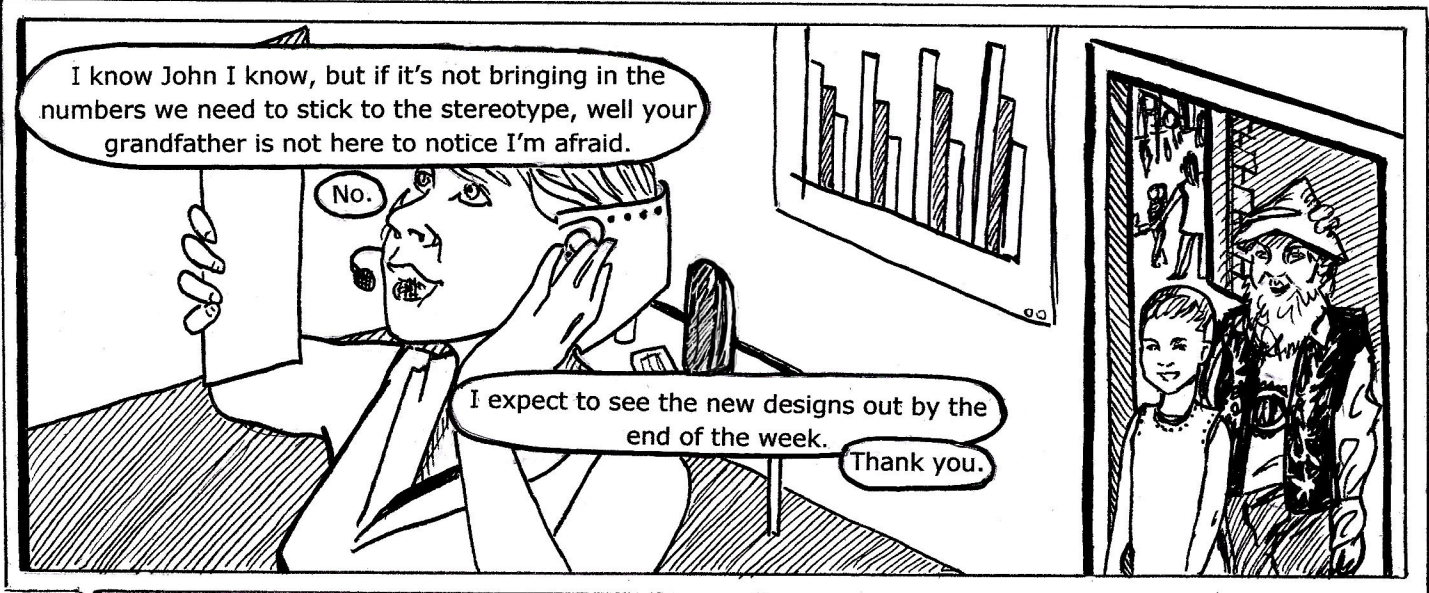
No, no, that's fully booked today actually, um,

Yes Finnish I get it. You can finish things too, like your homework.





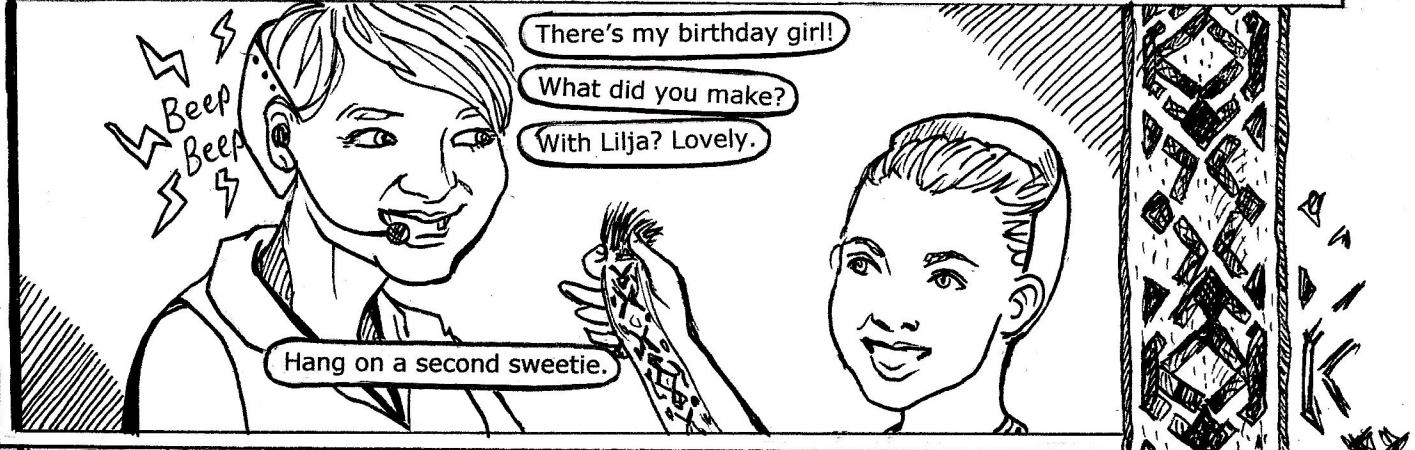


I know John I know, but if it's not bringing in the numbers we need to stick to the stereotype, well your grandfather is not here to notice I'm afraid.

Hang on a second sweetie.



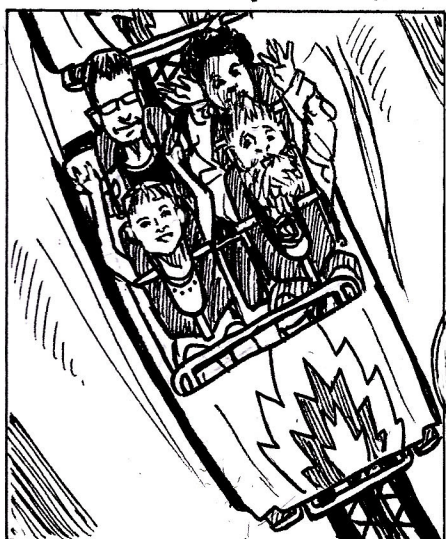
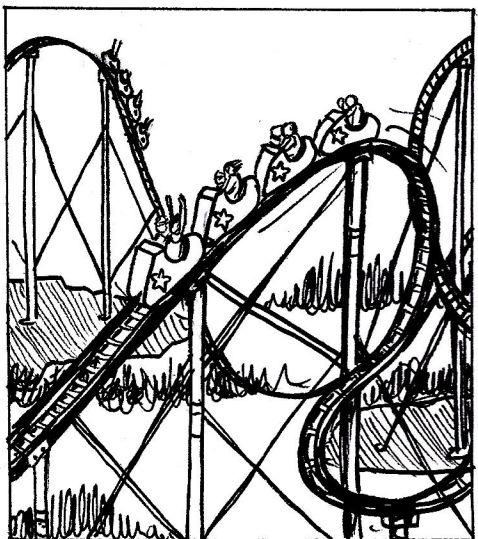
Yes? Again? Flo can you organise a code 8 in the glass house please? Now please? Oh and make sure the new recruits have signed the safety waiver. In the shared drive.
