

#### **Curriculum Vitae Anne Brasseur**

Minister for Education, Vocational Training and Sport of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg (ret.)

Born on May 19, 1950 in Luxembourg

After her baccalaureate in Luxembourg in 1969, Anne Brasseur studied psychology at the Universities in Tübingen and in Mannheim, graduating in 1975. She worked in the Service de Psychologie et d'Orientation scolaires of a vocational school others, and headed the Service Central d'Assistance Sociale at the Office of the Attorney General.

In 1975, she was elected to the Municipal Council of the City of Luxembourg, where she served with an interruption of six years until September 2009, In 1979, she was elected to the Chambre des Députés for the first time. From 1980 to 1994, she was president of the Association des Femmes Libérales, which named her an honorary member. From 19981 to 1999 and from 2005 to 2009 she was a deputy mayor of the City of Luxembourg of the city of Luxembourg.

From 1999 to 2004, she was Minister of Education, Vocational Training and Sport in the Juncker-Polfer coalition government. She was re-elected to the Chambre des Députés in Luxembourg's 2013 parliamentary elections. In 2018, she renounced her mandate.

In the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe, of which she was a member from 1995 to 1999 and again since 2009, she has been President of the Alliance of Liberals and Democrats for Europe since 2009 and President of the Parliamentary Assembly from 2014 to 2016. From 2016 to 2018 she served as an Ambassador of the No Hate Speech Movement. She is a member of the jury of the Nuremberg International Human Rights Award and of the Vaclav Havel Human Rights Prize..

Until her election on September 16, 2022, to the Board of the Friedrich Naumann Foundation for Freedom, Anne Brasseur had been a member of the Foundation's Board of Trustees since March 2018.
